

AAUW Jane Shaw Knox Adopt-a-Student Scholarship

Description

The Jane Shaw Knox Adopt-a-Student Scholarship was developed by the members of the Fort Atkinson Branch of the American Association of University Women, (AAUW) to provide a local scholarship to women for the purpose of completing a bachelor's degree.

The concept held a special appeal to Jane Shaw Knox, a charter and life member of the branch. Jane was born in Painesdale, Mich. She attended the Chicago Art Institute and the University of Wisconsin-Madison before entering Michigan State University where she graduated magna cum laude. Before her marriage to William D. Knox, she taught high school mathematics and English. Following marriage, they resided in Fort Atkinson where she was a prominent and active worker in the community.

Following her death in 1987, the Knox family established a memorial fund through the Fort Atkinson Community Foundation for the Knox/Adopt-a-Student Scholarship Fund. In appreciation of her friendship, leadership, many contributions to AAUW and interest in this project, the scholarship is named the Jane Shaw Knox Adopt-a-Student Scholarship.

Eligibility

Eligible students are women who:

- Are either a graduate of Fort Atkinson High School, have a current Fort Atkinson mailing address, or are currently employed in Fort Atkinson.
- Are planning to be enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours for consecutive semesters, in a program at an accredited college in pursuit of a bachelor's degree, and have already earned 45 credits toward that degree.
- Have demonstrated academic competence.

Selection

All applications will be reviewed by the AAUW Scholarship Committee, advised by the Community Foundation's Administrator. Financial need may be considered but is not a requirement. Preference may be given to women who are in returning to higher education after an absence. The Board of Directors of the Fort Atkinson Community Foundation must approve the final recommendations for scholarship awards made by AAUW's Scholarship Committee.
